#### **Singapore Cooperation Programme**

Singapore has provided technical assistance to other developing countries since the 1960s. As a country whose only resource is its people, Singapore believes that human resource development is vital for economic and social progress. Singapore itself has benefited from training provided by other countries and international organisations.

In 1992, the Singapore Cooperation Programme (SCP) was established to bring the various technical assistance programs offered by Singapore together under one framework. Through the SCP, the range and number of programs were increased to share Singapore's development experience with other developing countries.

To date, Singapore has sponsored courses and study visits for over 125,000 officials from more than 170 countries and territories. The SCP is managed by the Technical Cooperation Directorate of the Singapore Ministry of Foreign Affairs

#### **Course Objectives**

Addressing issues related to coastal population and urbanisation, this course analyses policy-making on environmental sustainability in various areas.

#### **Synopsis**

Topics to be covered include:

- Sustainability and sustainable pathways
- Environmental threats in land, sea and air
- Pollution, health and climate change
- Freshwater sustainability and water security
- Food production and security
- Environmental conservation and Sustainable **Development Goals**

#### Methodology

This course will be highly engaging, intensive, experiential and dynamic, packed with learning journeys, hands-on and experience sharing. Training will be interspersed with formal lectures, class activities and group discussions.

#### Duration

The course will be held from 6 to 10 May 2019.
